# A few advising tips - 1

#### **Course Withdrawals**

#### The last day to withdraw from individual courses is October 30, 2023.

- There are several important things to know about withdrawals.
- The "W" indicator has no punitive value and is not averaged into your Rutgers GPA; only letter grades for courses completed at Rutgers (i.e., A, B+, B, C+, C, D, F) are calculated into your term and cumulative averages.
- 2) A "W" indicator will not affect your ability to go to graduate or professional school, secure internships, or get a job after graduation.
- 3) You can withdraw from individual classes, even if you will be going under 12 credits, but you should try to stay above 12 active credits. The "W" grade maintains your full-time status for housing, many types of financial aid, and health and auto insurance.
  - a. Exceptions: Rutgers NCAA athletes, students studying on F-1 or J-1 visas, and some scholarship and grant recipients must maintain 12 active credits. Check with the appropriate advisors in Athletics, International Student Services, or Financial Aid if you have questions.
- 4) There are no refunds for withdrawal from a single course.
- 5) Last day to add minicourses to round out to 12 credits (if needed) is tomorrow, 10/26!

#### The Differences in Farm EL Courses

- NEW! Introduction to Animal Handling 150:01-11 teaches the basics of handling horses, goats, sheep, cows, pigs, and poultry two weeks at a time. Offered Fall, Spring, and Summer.
- Animal Handling, Fitting & Exhibition 175: C1, C2, DO, E1, E2, G1, G2, HO, S1, S2 focuses on one species (cows, dogs, sheep, goats, horses, or pigs) in each section. Students groom and train the animals for Ag Field Day (April 27, 2024). ONLY offered in Spring.
- Animal Handling Supervisors 176: CA, DO, GO, HO, SH, SW. Students supervise undergraduates enrolled in Animal Handling, Fitting & Exhibition 175 and must attend Ag Field Day. ONLY offered in Spring. Click <a href="here">here</a> to fill out an application.
- Practicums: Cattle 201, Small Ruminant 202, Swine 203, Lab Animal 205, and Horse 207 focuses on the management, breeding, husbandry, nutrition, marketing, etc., of each species. Offered Fall, Spring, and Summer.

# Important News about Summer 2024!

- The 2-credit practicums (201, 202, 203, 205, 207) will NOT be offered.
- The 1-credit 150 Intro to Animal Handling will be offered.
- Other Summer 2024 course offerings will be released in February 2024.



## Biochemistry and Organic Chemistry

- SAS Biochemistry vs SEBS Biochemistry
  - 01:694:407 (SAS) requires Org Chem I as the prerequisite (01:160:307
     OR 01:160:308 OR 01:160:315 or 01:160:316 ).
  - 11:115:403 (SEBS) requires Org Chem I and II as the prerequisites (01:160:308 OR 01:160:316 OR 21:160:336).
  - Completion of Org Chem I and II is required for the Pre-Vet and Lab Animal Science tracks.
- Elementary Organic Lab (01:160:211)
  - Only offered in the Fall semester. Requires prerequisite Intro to Experimentation 01:160:171.
  - Completion of Elem Org is required for the Companion Animal Science track.
  - Elem Orgo Lecture (01:160:209) is not offered in Summer 2024.
- General Microbiology (3+1 lecture, 11:680:390) is preferred over the SAS Microbiology, fits better with AniSci schedule. Orgo 307 is the prereq.



# RUTGERS Differences between Physics Courses (All are accepted for vet school applications)

- Physics for Sciences (01:750:193/194)
  - Active learning. Better homework. Must register for 4-credit lecture and 0-credit lab together.
  - Always in Fall-Spring sequence, 193 offered in Fall 2024.
- Extended General Physics (01:750:201-202)
  - Best for students that haven't taken much physics previously
  - Must register for 5-credit lecture and 0-credit lab together.
  - In Spring-Fall sequence, 202 offered in Fall 2024.
- General Physics (01:750:203-205, 204-206)
  - Must register for 3-credit lecture and 1-credit lab together.
  - Both courses offered in all three semesters.



# Interested in Studying Abroad?

- CELA-Belize is for 3 or 6 EL credits (Summer-Winter sessions). Grades will be Pass/NC and will no longer be on an A-F scale.
